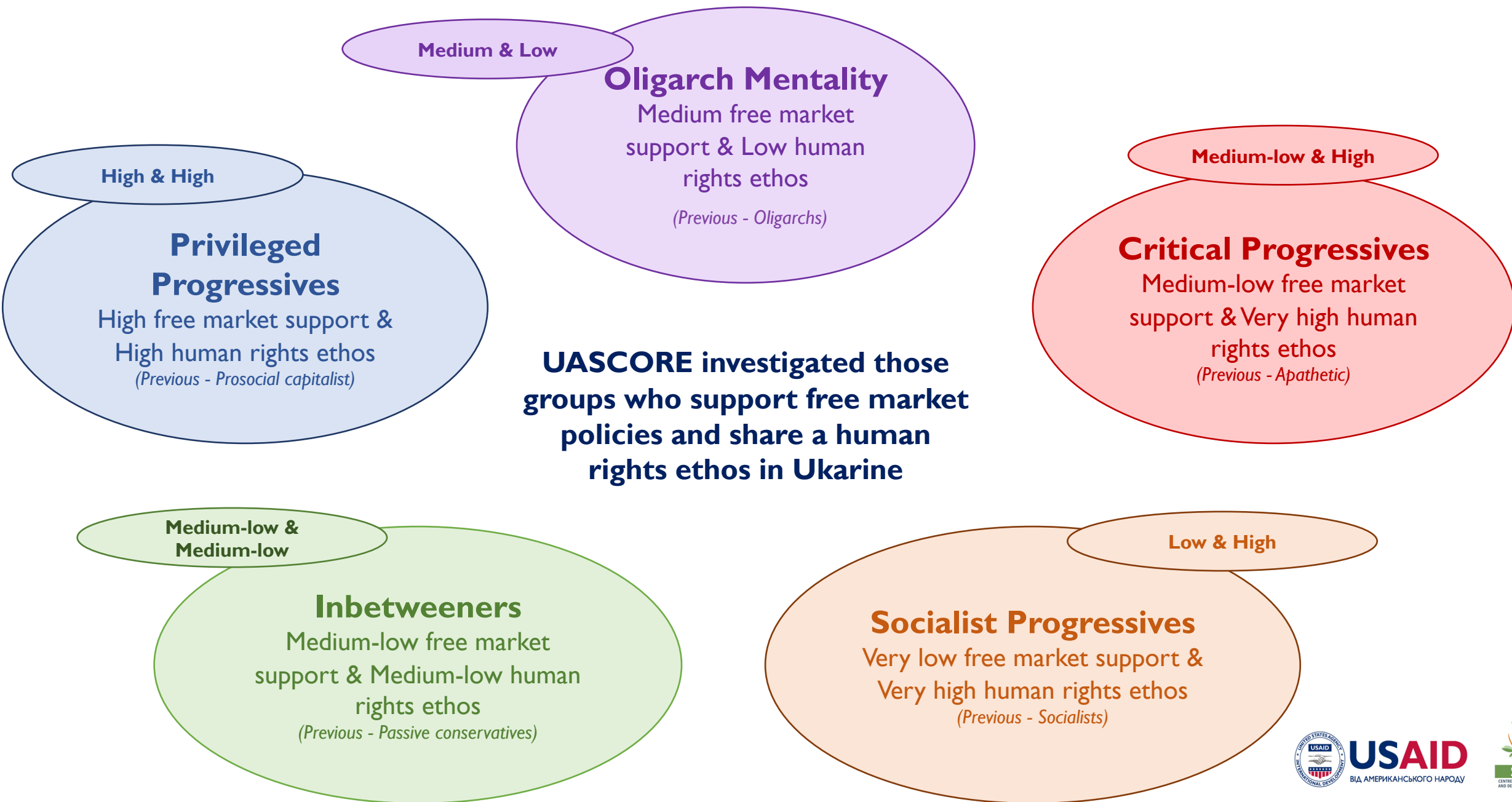

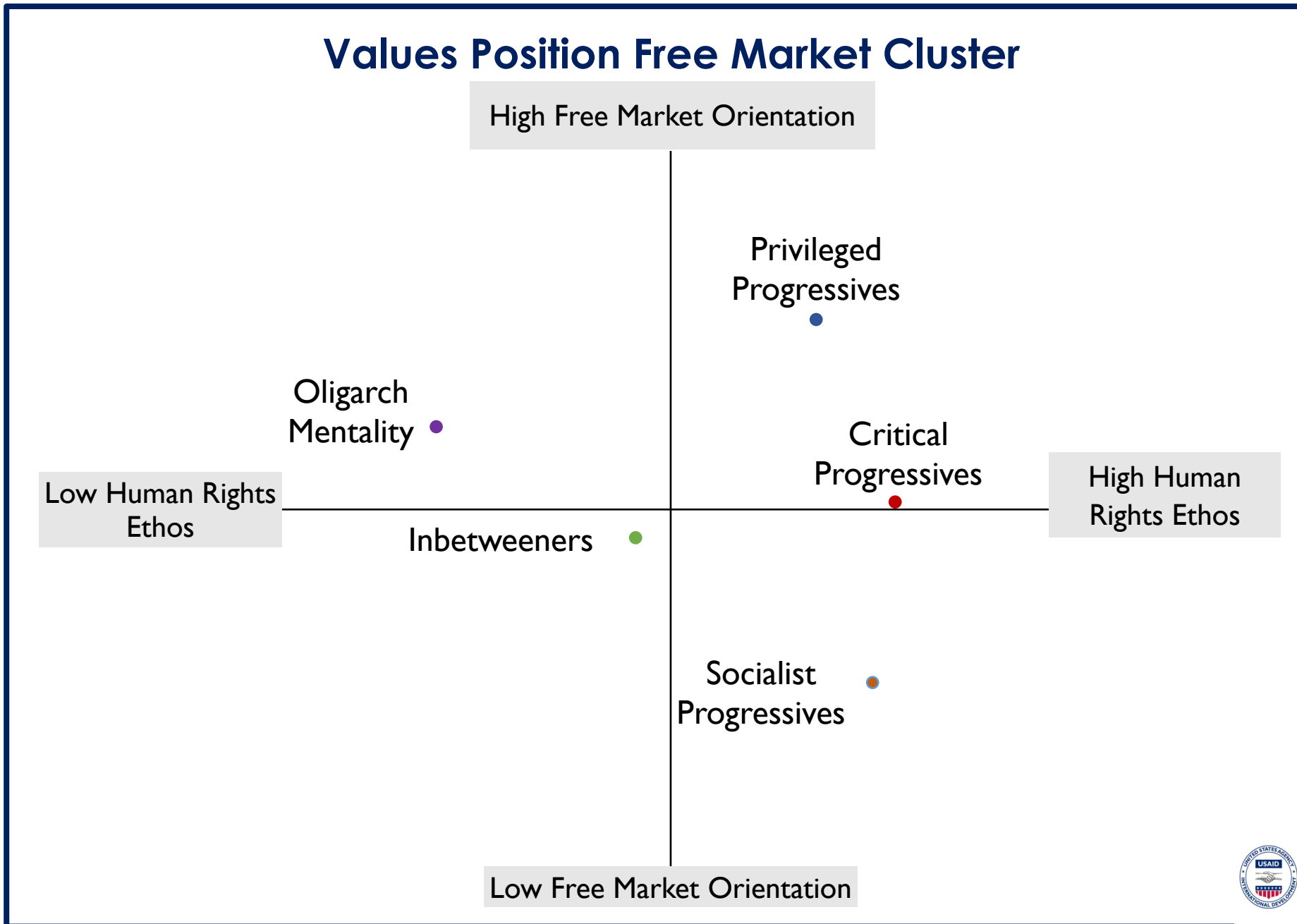

## Privileged Progressives

9.9% of the population

- Share human rights ethos and support EU orientation.
- Highest level of income.
- Strongest support for free market policies.
- Good social skills
- Strong trust in all institutions and community
- Share nationalistic sentiments.

## Oligarch Mentality

10.4% of the population

- Have weak human rights ethos and low civic responsibility.
- Trusts authorities but not the community
- High tolerance to corruption and do not perceive the EU as beneficial for Ukraine.
- Support separation of Donbas, do not share pluralist identity and is psychologically distressed.
- This group has a good income, positive perception of economic opportunities and support free market policies.

## Critical Progressives

39.0% of the population

- The most tolerant, pluralist and civically responsible with the strongest human rights ethos.
- Critical of national institutions and reforms; implementation.
- Strong trust in community, support reintegration of Donbas
- Boast good social skills and psychological wellbeing.
- Good income level and medium free market support.

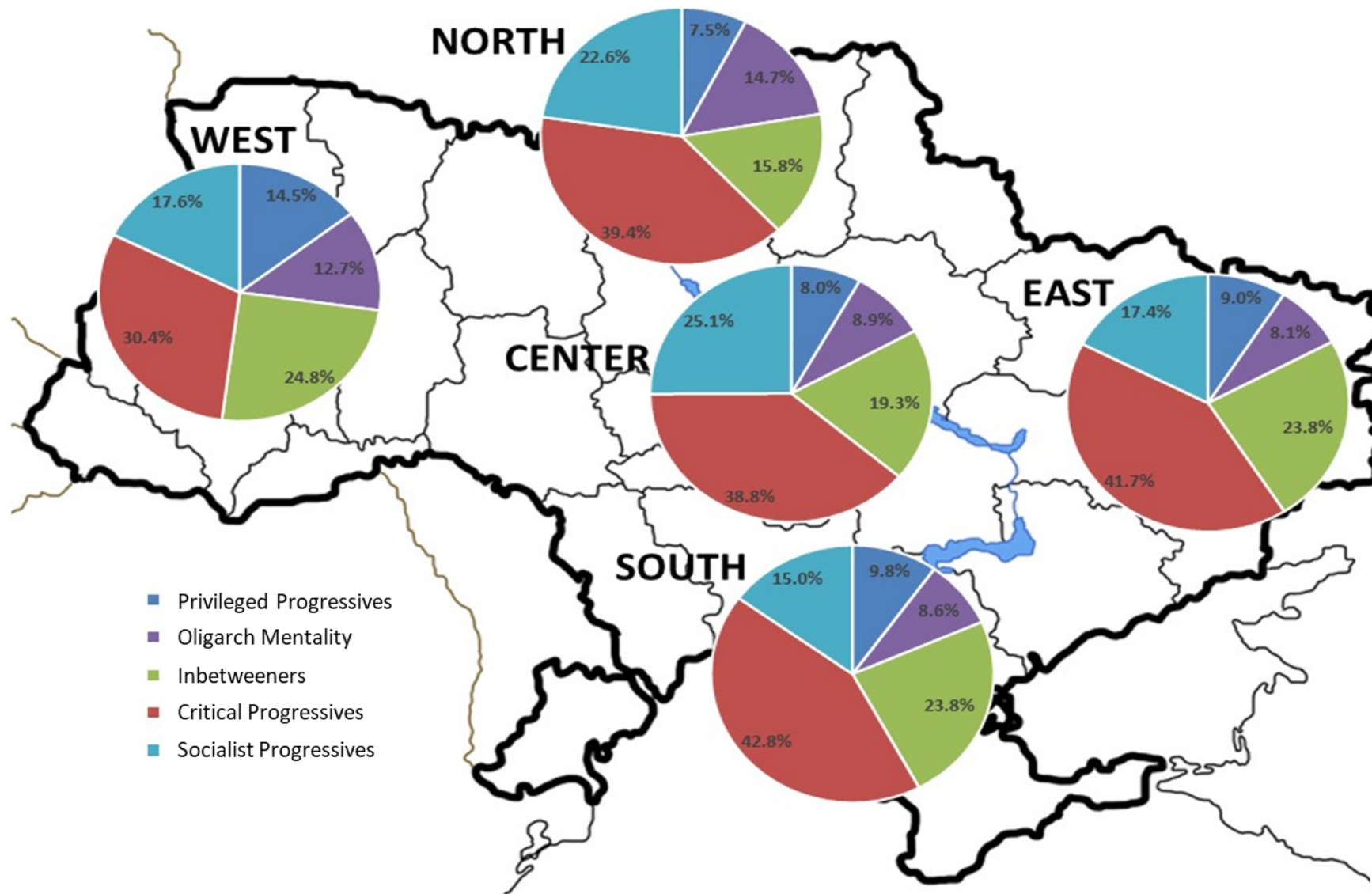
## Socialist Progressives

18.8% of the population

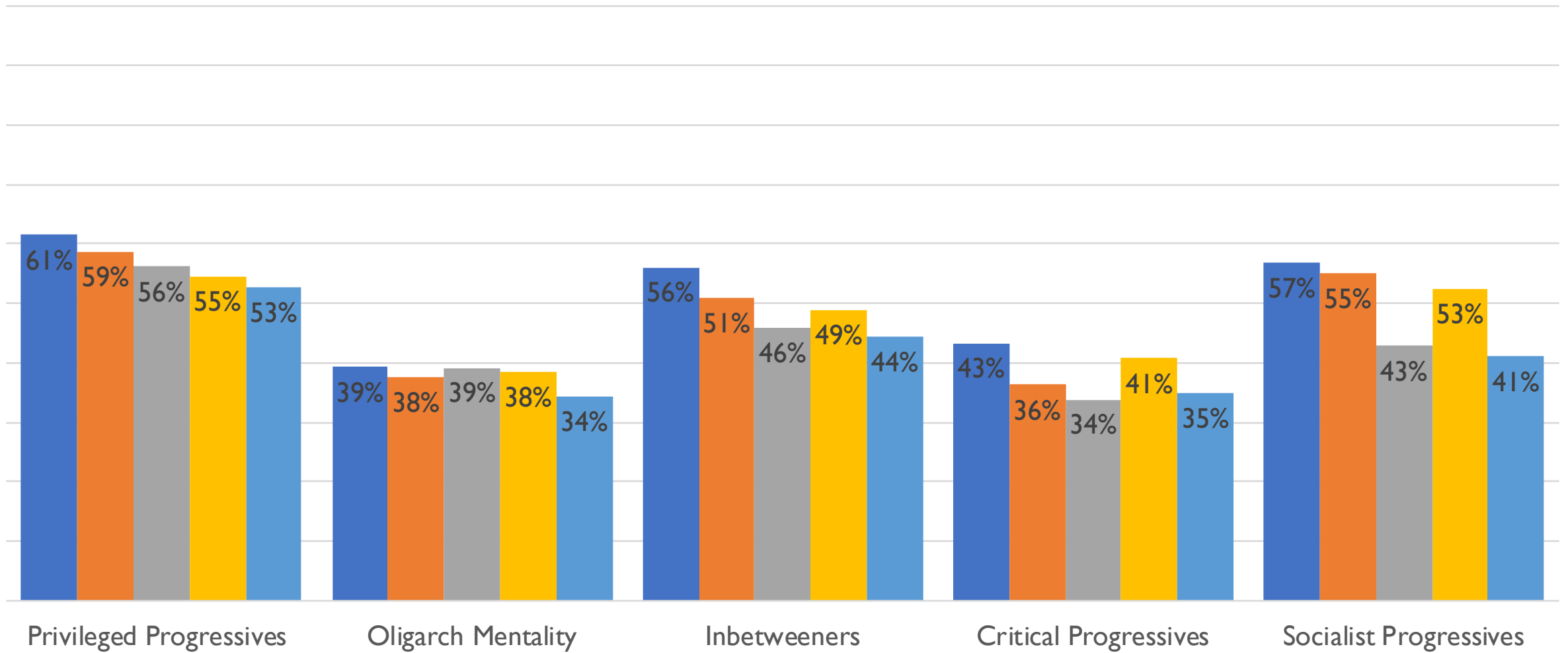
- Have strong human rights ethos, social tolerance and civically responsible.
- Trust in community more than trust in authorities and are critical of reforms' implementation
- Do not tolerate corruption and support Donbas reintegration.
- Highest vocational and literacy skills, excellent social and executive skills.
- Lowest income level, highest expectations of economic instability and have the weakest free market support
